

Biography of Colonel Paul W. Moreshead

Colonel Paul Moreshead assumed his current position as Deputy Director, Air Land Sea Space Application Center in August 2025. He is a career Army Aviation Officer and UH-60 Blackhawk pilot with more than 24 years of service in operational Army and Department of Defense assignments. COL Moreshead graduated from flight school in May of 2002 and spent more than 6 years assigned to the 25th Infantry Division in Hawaii from 2002 to 2008. This tour included 27 months deployed to Afghanistan and Iraq where he served in multiple positions culminating as a Blackhawk company commander during the surge in Iraq. From 2008 to 2010 he trained and coached Army Aviation units for their future combat deployments as an Observer/Controller at the National Training Center, Fort Irwin, California. From 2011 to 2013 he was assigned to the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) at Fort Campbell, Kentucky as a battalion executive officer and operations officer and again deployed to Afghanistan. In 2014 he and his wife moved to Stuttgart, Germany where he held various positions including Executive Officer to the Deputy Commander at United States Africa Command where he served until 2018. COL Moreshead commanded the 2916th Aviation Battalion at The National Training Center in California from 2018 to 2020. Following completion from the Air War College in 2021, he served in Hohenfels, Germany at the Joint Multinational Readiness Center (JMRC). There he first served as the Senior Aviation Trainer and then as the JMRC Deputy Commander. Most recently he served as commander of the 128th Aviation Brigade (AIT) at Fort Eustis, Virginia from 2023 to 2025.

Colonel Moreshead is a graduate of the University of Central Florida (2001, History), The Army Command and General Staff College, The Joint Combined Warfighting School, and The Air War College. He has more than 2,400 flight hours as a UH-60 and LUH-72 pilot. He is married to Bethany Moreshead, and they have one daughter, Sofia, age 6.
