The following is a professional opinion article from the Air Land Sea Space Application Center.

“ALSSA Products: The Range of TTP Solutions”

From its inception, the Air Land Sea Space Application (ALSSA) Center was intended to be a catalyst for addressing joint problems. Inherent in the idea of catalyzing change is the need to be adaptive. While the preponderance of ALSSA's work is in publication of formally developed multi-Service tactics, techniques, and procedures (MTTP), the rapidly changing strategic environment and changes in the character of warfare require ALSSA to offer other, more agile products. Over the years ALSSA has evolved its product “toolkit” and continues to do so, even while the management and regular updates of ALSSA's 28 MTTP remain a core part of our work. Development and publication of Research Studies and an additional newer option, the ALSSA Tactical Bulletin (TACBUL), are two important tools ALSSA offers the joint force.

Since 1975, ALSSA action officers (AOs) have authored more than 50 formal reports resulting from the study of (mostly tactical) joint warfighting problems. The frequency of these studies has grown due to increasing rates of change in the operating environment, with ALSSA AOs completing well over half of them since 2010. These studies scope problems and make recommendations about what should come next in the development of doctrine and warfighting TTP. ALSSA AOs travel to observe exercises, consult with subject matter experts (SMEs) in both institutional and operational organizations and review existing doctrine, Service TTP, and other literature to understand tactical problems. Each Research Study proceeds on its own timeline, overseen by the ALSSA director, to ensure the completion of a comprehensive but timely product. Common access card holders can view study results on the ALSSA website. Depending on the conclusions, the findings of a study can lead to the development of a new MTTP or be included in the next revision of an existing MTTP. Alternatively, if the TTP are time-sensitive or nascent and not ready for typical doctrinal publication, ALSSA can publish them for further testing and evaluation via ALSSA TACBULs.

The TACBUL is intended to quickly publish emerging TTP, capitalizing on ALSSA's relationship with both institutional doctrine centers and operational units to ensure rapid dissemination. ALSSA AOs write these documents by working directly with SMEs in designated joint working groups (JWGs) much like normal MTTP production. Unlike MTTP publications, Service doctrine leads are informed but not asked to sign TACBULs. The ALSSA director is the only signatory and TACBULs are available on the ALSSA website. Following publication, ALSSA AOs will endeavor to maintain contact with SMEs and predominant users for further study, testing and professional discussion. ALSSA's goal is to see the TTP in a TACBUL used in exercises to demonstrate validity in a controlled environment and better inform follow-on incorporation into doctrine as appropriate. To date, ALSSA has published two TACBULs, both of which are available on ALSSA websites (One is classified SECRET and available on SIPR).

The preponderance of ALSSA's work remains the development of comprehensive and authoritative MTTP. These prescriptive publications gain approval and signatures from some or all Service doctrine leads: the LeMay Center, Mission Command Center

of Excellence, Navy Warfare Development Center, Training and Education Command Policy and Standards Division, and Space Delta 10. Occasionally, the United States Coast Guard and Special Operations Command also act as signatories on select topics. Due to the large scale of the intended audience, MTTP have the longest development process. ALSSA AOs lead a detailed revision process to create these publications working directly with SMEs through multiple JWGs. The update interval varies depending on publication, usually three to five years. One of ALSSA's newest publications, (Fighter Integration) is updated annually. However, any ALSSA publication can be prioritized for more rapid updates if required, based on the needs of the operational force. ALSSA MTTP can also be found on ALSSA's NIPR or SIPR websites.

The ALSSA Center's mission is to rapidly assess and provide multi-Service solutions for tactical warfighters by filling gaps in existing and emerging TTP to improve interoperability and lethality. The ALSSA Center utilizes this tiered, complementary suite of products to accomplish that mission. This structured but flexible approach allows us, working alongside front-line warfighters and SMEs, to address tactical interoperability gaps with a tailored response, ensuring that solutions are delivered with the appropriate speed, scope, and authority to meet the evolving needs of the joint force.
